- 1. NSSNET-2025 is a test for admission to Class-VI and VII in Navayug School, Sarojini Nagar, New Delhi for the academic year 2025-26.
- Candidates can apply for NSSNET-2025 "Online" only on the website https://exams.nta.ac.in/NSSNET/

 The Application Form other than online mode will not be accepted.
- 3. There is no Fee for online registration and for appearing in the entrance Test -NSSNET-2025.
- 4. Only one application is to be submitted by a candidate. If a candidate submits more than one Application Form for admission at the same level, his/her Application Forms shall summarily be rejected.
- 5. Candidates must follow the instructions strictly as given in the Information Bulletin and on NTA website https://exams.nta.ac.in/NSSNET/, https://exams.nta.ac.in/NSSNET/. Candidates not complying with the instructions shall be summarily disgualified.
- 6. Candidates must ensure that e-mail address and mobile number provided in the online application form are their own or that of their parents, as all information/ communication will be sent by NTA through e-mail on the given e-mail address or SMS on given mobile number only.

 - Category Certificate, if applicable- (file size: 30 kb to 150 kb) in PDF format

(If the information given or documents uploaded are not correct or incomplete or cannot be corroborated with the required original certificates at the time of admission, the candidate is liable to be rejected and admission denied to him or her)

Both the above steps can be done together in one go or at different times.

- 8. The final submission of Online Application Form will remain incomplete if Step-2 is not complete. Such forms will stand rejected and no correspondence on this account will be entertained.
- 9. Candidates are advised to keep the application number and password generated during registration confidential and use them to view registration data and download admit card, results etc.
- 10. Any request to change the exam center, date and time provided on the admit cards shall not be considered under any circumstances.

1.1 ABOUT NATIONAL TESTING AGENCY (NTA)

The Ministry of Education (MOE), Government of India (GOI) has established National Testing Agency (NTA) as an independent autonomous and self-sustained premier examining organization under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 for conducting efficient, transparent and international standards exams in order to assess the competency of candidates for admissions to premier higher educational institutions.

The objectives of NTA, inter-alia, include:

- i. To conduct efficient, transparent and international standard exams in order to assess the competency of candidates for admission.
- ii. To undertake research on educational, professional and examining system to identify gaps in the knowledge systems and take steps for bridging them.
- iii. To produce and disseminate information and research on education and professional development standards.

1.2 ABOUT NAVAYUG SCHOOL EDUCATION SOCIETY

The Navayug School Educational Society (NSES) is registered with Registrar of Societies, GNCTD under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 and is funded through support from the New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) in the form of 100% grant-in aid. NSES runs 12 Navayug Schools (07 Senior Secondary, 01 Secondary and 04 Primary Schools) in NDMC area. NSES is marking significant impact in the field of education by catering to quality education to about 9000 students through its schools.

1.3 NAVAYUG SCHOOL, SAROJINI NAGAR

Navayug school was set up on 16th February 1973 "as a gift for the gifted children of all castes and class on the 25th anniversary of our country with a vision to prepare the students to serve the country with their highly developed skills and a noble attitude of mind tuned to the ways of the new era ushering in an egalitarian society" by the then Prime Minister.

Navayug School, Sarojini Nagar has nurtured several generations of students, who have gone on to make remarkable contributions in various fields. Over the past five decades the school has produced incredible alumni who have excelled in various fields such as Civil Services, defense, medicine, engineering, art, music, sports, accounts, law and other high-ranking professions. The school's legacy is built on a strong foundation of academic rigor, character development and leadership.

Navayug School, Sarojini Nagar is a Co-educational English medium school. It offers CBSE curriculum-based education from class VI to XII. It has excellent infrastructure where various sports like Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Cricket, Table Tennis, Swimming, Badminton, Athletics and Chess are available under the close supervision and guidance of qualified staff. Full-fledged Department of Music and Department of Arts is also available in the school with dedicated and experienced teachers. The school has well equipped Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and Computer Laboratory. It has well organized digital Library and an ATL (Atal Tinkering Laboratory) which is a government initiative to encourage innovation among school students. 1.4 ADMISSION TO NAVAYUG SCHOOL, SAROJINI NAGAR

Admission to the Navayug School Sarojini Nagar will be at Class VI and VII level only. It will be done purely on the basis of merit, i.e. marks obtained in a written test called **NSSNET-2025**. NSES has entrusted the responsibility of conducting the above test to NTA.

ADMISSION TO NAVAYUG SCHOOL, SAROJINI NAGAR

2.1 ADMISSION CRITERIA

Admission to Class VI and VII of the Navayug School, Sarojini Nagar for the academic year 2025-26, is through a written examination called NSSNET-2025.

All admissions will be on merit basis. Reservation of seats as applicable will be followed as per Government Norms.

Admission in Navayug School, Sarojini Nagar in Class-VI and VII will be strictly on the merit basis by holding an Entrance Test. The class wise available seats are as under:

2.2 ROLE OF NTA

NSSNET-2025 will be conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA).

The responsibility of NTA is limited to inviting online applications for NSSNET-2025, conduct of the NSSNET-2025, processing and declaration of result and providing the merit list to the NSES.

2.3 DATE OF NSSNET-2025

NSSNET-2025 covers admission to Class VI and VII for the session 2025-26 in the Navayug School, Sarojini Nagar and will be held on 08.05.2025 (Thursday).

3.1 GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

NSSNET-2025 will be conducted as per the guidelines prescribed by the Navayug School Education Society (NSES).

- i. Merely appearing and passing in NSSNET-2025 does not confer any right to the candidate for admission to the Navayug School, Sarojini Nagar.
- ii. The selection and admission to Navayug School, Sarojini Nagar is subject to fulfilling the admission criteria, eligibility, rank in merit list, verification of original documents and such other criteria as may be prescribed by the Navayug School Education Society.
- iii. Applications of candidates submitting false and fabricated information will be rejected and such candidates will be further debarred from appearing in examinations conducted by NTA.
- iv. Incomplete application and applications not in accordance with instructions are liable be rejected without any further intimation.
- v. Instructions in the Information Bulletin may change /be updated based on decisions taken by the NTA and other authorities from time to time. Candidates are advised to regularly check the website https://exams.nta.ac.in/NSSNET/ for any further updates or information.
- vi. NTA reserves the right to withdraw permission, granted inadvertently if any, to any candidate who is not eligible to appear in the NSSNET-2025 even though the Admit Card had been issued by the NTA.

3.7 CENTRES / CITIES FOR NSSNET-2025

Exam Centres for NSSNET-2025 will be in New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) area only.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

4.1 ELIGIBILITY TO APPEAR IN NSSNET-2025

- A candidate should be between 10 and 12 years as on 31st March 2025 for admission to Class VI, i.e. he/she should have been born between 01st April, 2013 and 31st March, 2015 (both days inclusive) for admission to the academic year 2025-26 and
- For Class VII, a candidate should be between 11 and 13 years as on 31st March 2025 for admission to Class VII, i.e. he/she should have been born between 01st April, 2012 and 31st March, 2014 (both days inclusive) for admission to the academic year 2025-26
- Applicant should have passed in Class V / VI Annual examinations as on 31.03.2025 for admission in class VI and VII respectively from a recognized School.

4.2 PASSING MARKS FOR ADMISSION

- A candidate is eligible for admission to the Navayug School, Sarojini Nagar, if he/ she secures a minimum of 65% i.e. 78 marks in the aggregate with the condition that candidate should obtain at least 50% marks in each subject in NSSNET-2025 for admission in class VI or VII.
- However, the condition of minimum marks can be reviewed by NSES if a need so arises.
- Admission will be based on the merit prepared on the basis of the marks obtained in NSSNET 2025, medical fitness and verification of requisite documents.

CHAPTER 5 FACILITY FOR PWD CANDIDATES

5.1 Provisions relating to Persons with Disability (PwD):

- As per Section 2(t) of the RPwD Act, "**Persons with Disability (PwD)**" means a person with long-term physical, mental, intellectual, or sensory impairment which, in interaction with barriers, hinders his full and effective participation in society equally with others.
- According to Section 2(r) of the RPwD Act, 2016, "persons with benchmark disabilities" means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority.
- The "specified disabilities", which are included in the Schedule of the RPwD Act, are as follows:

5.2 Facilities for PwD Candidates to Appear in the Exam:

As per the guidelines issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) under Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment issued from time to time on the subject: "Written Examination for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities", A candidate with one of the benchmark disabilities [as defined in Section 2(r) of RPwD Act, 2016], holding a Disability Certificate in the format prescribed in **Annexure-III**, is entitled to the following facilities:

- Scribe shall be given, if so desired by a person with benchmark disabilities in the category of blindness, locomotor disability (Both Arms affected-BA) and cerebral palsy.
- The facility of Scribe, in case he/she has a physical limitation and a scribe is essential to write the examination on his/her behalf, being so certified in the aforesaid format by

- a CMO/Civil Surgeon/ Medical Superintendent of a Government Health Care Institution, will be provided.
- Compensatory time of not less than 20 minutes per hour of examination will be provided. If the examination is of 03 hours duration, the compensatory time shall be 01 hour. In case the duration of the examination is less or more than 03 hours, the compensatory time shall be on pro rata basis.
- The compensatory time will be given to a candidate with benchmark disabilities, whether such candidate uses the facility of Scribe or not. Services of a Scribe As per the office memorandum of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (Reference: F. No. 34-02/2015-DD-III dated August 29, 2018), the PwD candidates who are visually impaired OR dyslexic (severe) OR have a disability in the upper limbs OR have lost fingers/hands thereby preventing them from properly operating the Computer Based Test platform may avail the services of a scribe (amanuensis).
- The scribe will help the Candidate in reading the questions and/or keying in the answers as per the directions of the Candidate.
- A scribe will NEITHER explain the questions NOR suggest any solutions. PwBD candidates who desire to avail the services of a scribe need to opt for this during the online registration.
- ❖ A copy of the PwBD certificate must be uploaded at the time of online registration. The formats for the PwBD certificate are given in **Annexure-III**.
- ❖ It is to be noted that the Scribe will be provided by the National Testing Agency. However, the candidate is also permitted to bring his/her own scribe (Annexure-IV), if he/she so chooses.
- If it is found at any stage that a candidate has availed the services of a scribe and/or availed the compensatory time, but does not possess the extent of disability that warrants the use of a scribe and/or grant of compensatory time, the candidate will be excluded from the process of evaluation, ranking, counseling, and admission. In case such a candidate has already been admitted to any Institution, the admission of the candidate will be cancelled. Candidates are advised to go through the Public Notice No. NTA/Exam/PwD/Scribe/2022 dated 11.09.2022 on the NTA website www.nta.ac.in in this regard.

5.3 Facilities for PwD candidates who have less than 40% disability and have a limitation in writing and a scribe is essential to write the exam on his/her behalf:

A PwD candidate with less than 40% disability and has a limitation in writing and a scribe is essential to write the exam on his/her behalf, being so certified in the prescribed format (Annexure-V) by a CMO/Civil Surgeon/ Medical Superintendent of a Govt. Health Care Institution will be provided a scribe by NTA. He is required to state his requirements in his application form. He/she is also permitted to bringhis/her own Scribe along with an undertaking in the format given at Annexure-VI.

The Candidate cannot change the category or sub-category (PwD status) after the submission of the Online Application Form, and in any case, no change will be entertained by NTA after the declaration of scores. Therefore, the candidates are advised to fill the category / sub-category column very carefully.

STEPS IN FILLING UP THE EXAMINATION FORM

6.1 HOW TO APPLY FOR NSSNET-2025

A candidate can apply for NSSNET-2025, online only at https://exams.nta.ac.in/NSSNET/.

Candidates are advised to:

- Read the Information Bulletin carefully and ensure that they fulfill the eligibility requirements before applying.
- Keep all required information such as scanned documents of photographs, signature, birth certificate issued by the Municipal Committee/Board/Corporation or Registrar of Births and Death or transfer certificate, caste certificates, ID proof, mobile phones for getting OTPs, etc. before applying online so that the relevant document can be promptly uploaded.

Step I: Registration Page

- i. Candidate's Name/Mother's Name/Father's Name as in the school records. Date of Birth in dd/mm/yyyy format as recorded in date of birth certificate/school records.
- ii. Identification Type: Candidates need to provide any one of the following identity details:
 - Aadhaar Card / any other Photo ID Card issued by any Govt. Authority or a letter with Photograph and Signature of the Candidate attested by the Principal of the School where the candidate is studying.
- iii. Mobile Number and e-mail Address: Candidates must provide Mobile Number or email address (their own or that of their parents).
- iv. Provide complete postal address with PIN Code (Correspondence and Permanent address) for further correspondence.

Step II: Fill in the complete Application Form

The application particulars entered in Step-I can be edited before final submission of the Application Form except Mobile No. and Email address, which will not be changed after final submit of Application form.

Note:

- Candidates are advised to verify the correctness of the information provided by them
 by pre-viewing the online application form before final submission. If required
 candidates may edit their application form before submission.
- Only one application should be submitted by a candidate.
- Once finally submitted, details filled in certain specific fields may be changed only during correction window. After that no communication in this regard will be entertained.
- Candidates are not required to send / submit hard copy of Confirmation Page to NTA
 office. However, the candidates are advised to retain the hard copy of the
 Confirmation Page for future need.

Uploading of scanned images Candidate's Photograph: to be uploaded

- Passport size Photograph (size: 10kb to 100kb) in JPG format.
- The photographs must be taken on or after 1stMarch 2025 preferably indicating clearly the name of candidate along with the date of taking the photograph. Photograph should not be with cap or goggles. The focus needs to be on face (80% face coverage, ears clearly visible, on white background)
- Spectacles are allowed only if being used regularly.
- Polaroid and Computer-generated photos are not acceptable.
- Applications not complying with these instructions or with unclear photographs are liable to be rejected.
- Application without photographs shall be rejected.
- The photographs need not be attested. Candidates are advised to keep 6 to 8 passport size and colour photographs with white background.
- Candidates may note that if the photographs uploaded are found to be fabricated or defaced or seem to be hand-made or computer made etc., the application of the Candidate will be rejected and the same will be considered as using Unfair Means (UFM) and the candidate would be dealt with accordingly.
- In case someone else's or unrelated photographs have been uploaded, the candidature shall be cancelled and the case will be considered as using UFM.
 Criminal action as per laws of the country shall also be initiated

Candidate's Signature: to be uploaded

- The candidate should put his/her full signature in running hand writing not in capital letter on white paper with Black Ink pen and scan for uploading.
- File size must be between 4kb to 100kb in JPG format.
- Online Application Forms without uploaded signatures will be rejected.
- In case someone else's signature has been uploaded, the candidature shall be cancelled and the case will be considered as using UFM. Criminal action as per laws of the country shall also be initiated.

Uploading of other certificates:

- Category certificate is to be uploaded, if applicable
- PwD certificate is to be uploaded, if applicable
- File size must be between 30 kb to 150 kb in PDF format.

6.2 CHECK LIST FOR FILLING THE ONLINE APPLICATION FORM

The candidates are advised to ensure the following points before submitting the Online Application Forms:

- Whether they fulfill the prescribed eligibility conditions for the exam.
- That they have furnished the correct name, address and date of birth.
- That they have selected their gender viz. Male/Female correctly.
- Whether they have kept a Printout of Application Form (Confirmation Page) for their own record.

Notes:

- The requisite documents (including original) and candidature will be verified at various stages of the exam process against the details provided by the candidates during the online registration/application. The candidature is liable to be rejected if the candidate fails to produce the requisite documents or if the candidate is not able to furnish the requisite documents which corroborates with the details given in the online application form.
- Candidates are advised to maintain secrecy regarding their application number and password so as to prevent change of profile or data filled by them by other unauthorized persons.

6.3 COMMON SERVICES CENTRES / FACILITATION CENTRES

Candidates who are not conversant and are facing difficulties in the online application due to various constraints, can use the services of Common Services Centre, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India under the Digital India initiatives of Hon'ble Prime Minister. The Common Services Centre (CSC) scheme is a part of the ambitious National e Governance Plan (NeGP) of Government of India and is managed at each village panchayat level by a Village level Entrepreneur (VLE).

There are more than 1.5 lakhs Common Services Centres (CSC) across the country which will provide the desired support to candidates from urban as well as rural areas in online submission of application form. The list of the Common Services Centre is available on website: www.csc.gov.in.

NDMC will also set up facilitation centres in all its Atal Adarsh Vidyalayas and Navayug Schools.

BARRED ITEMS

7.1 BARRED ITEMS

Candidates are not allowed to carry the following items inside the examination centre under any circumstances. Candidates will be subjected to extensive and compulsory frisking before entering the exam centre.

- Any stationery item like textual material (printed or written) bits of papers, geometry/pencil box, Plastic Pouch, calculator, docu-pen, scale, writing pad, pen drives, eraser, electronic pen or scanner etc
- Any communication device like mobile phone, blue tooth, earphones, micro phone, pager, health band etc
- Other items like wallet, goggles, handbags, belt, cap etc
- Any watch or wristwatch, bracelet, camera etc
- Any ornaments/metallic item
- Any food item opened or packed
- Any other item which could be used for unfair means, by hiding communication device like microchip, camera, Bluetooth device etc.

No arrangement will be made at the centres for keeping any articles / items belonging to the candidates.

In case any candidate is found in possession of any of the barred items inside the centre it will be considered as use of Unfair Means and action will be taken against the candidate in accordance with the relevant provisions.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

8.1 INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- It is expected that parents/guardians will guide their wards appropriately on the following issues before leaving home for appearing in NSSNET-2025.
- Candidates should avoid coming with more than one escort (parent/ guardian). Escorts shall remain outside the gate during the conduct of the examination.
- Candidate will not be allowed to enter the exam centre after 10.30 AM. Therefore, the
 candidate shall leave home well in advance, taking into consideration various factors such as
 traffic, location of the centre and weather conditions etc. It would be appropriate to visit the
 centre a day before the examination to confirm the location, distance etc. to avoid any problem
 of reaching late at the centre and then not being allowed to appear in the examination.
- Candidate shall follow all the instructions and maintain discipline in the examination hall.
- Candidate shall not breach any examination rule.
- Candidate shall not use or promote any unfair means activity during the examination.
- Candidate will not be allowed to leave the exam hall till the conclusion of the exam.
- Candidate is advised not to attend examination on an empty stomach.
- In case the candidate finds another candidate using unfair means in the examination, the same shall be immediately informed to the invigilators on duty.
- Candidate are permitted to bring only the following items, to the examination centre:
 - Admit card (with Self Declaration on it downloaded from NTA website) with passport size photograph and thumb impression affixed on it
 - Valid and original Photo ID proof
 - Passport size photograph for affixing on the attendance sheet
 - Two simple transparent black ink ball point pens
 - Drinking water in a personal transparent water bottle
- A candidate shall not bring any barred items to the centre.
- Candidate shall co-operate in frisking with the staff at Examination Centre.
- Candidate will report at the centre at the time indicated on his/her admit card to make themselves available for compulsory frisking and completing other registration procedures.

- If your ward indulges in any unwanted activities, he/ she shall be debarred from taking this examination as per rules and shall also be liable for criminal action and or any action as may be deemed fit by NTA.

ADMIT CARD

9.1 ADMIT CARD

The Admit Card is issued provisionally to the candidates, subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility conditions.

Admit card will be uploaded on the NTA website https://exams.nta.ac.in/NSSNET/ https:/

The candidate has to download the Admit Card from the NTA website using their application number and date of birth and appear for the Examination at the given Centre on Date and Timing as indicated in his/her Admit Card.

Admit card is not transferable to any other person. Impersonation is a legally punishable offence.

No candidate will be allowed to appear at the examination centre, on Date and Timing other than that allotted to him/her in his/her Admit card.

In case candidate is unable to download Admit Card from the website, the candidate should approach the NTA Help Line between 10:00 am and 05:00 pm.

The candidates are advised to read the instructions on the Information Bulletin as well as on the Admit Card carefully and follow them during the conduct of the examination.

In case of any discrepancy in the details filled by the candidate or his/her photograph and signatures shown in the Admit Card and Confirmation Page, the candidate may immediately approach the Help Line between 10.00 am and 5.00 pm (Monday to Saturday). In such cases, candidates would appear in the examination with the already downloaded Admit Card. However, NTA will take necessary action to make correction in the records later.

Note:

- a. Candidate must be in possession of the Admit Card to appear in the examination.
- b. Candidate may please note that Admit Card will not be sent by post.
- c. In no case, the duplicate Admit Card for NSSNET-2025 would be issued at the Examination Centres.
- d. Candidate must not mutilate / disfigure the Admit Card or change any entry made therein.
- e. Candidates are advised to preserve their Admit Card in good condition for future reference.
- f. No Admit Card shall be issued to the candidates whose Applications are found to be incomplete for any reason (including indistinct/ doubtful photographs / without uploaded signatures) or who do not fulfill the eligibility criteria for the examination.
- g. Issue of Admit Card, however, shall not necessarily mean acceptance of eligibility which shall be further scrutinized at subsequent stages of admission process.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BE FOLLOWED IN THE EXAMINATION HALL

10.1 INSTRUCTIONS TO BE FOLLOWED IN THE EXAMINATION HALL

The Examination Centre will be opened two (02) hours before the commencement of the exam. Candidates must ensure that they leave home well in advance considering all factors like location of the centre, traffic, weather conditions, etc. Candidates are expected to report for the exam at the time indicated on their admit card.

- a) *However candidates are advised to arrive early to avoid last minute rush and crowding at the Verification Point and the consequent delay in entering the Examination Hall/Room for important activities like Scanning for temperature, Frisking, Checking of Admit Cards, Identification and Document Verification, Instructions, Writing particulars on Exam Booklet etc.
- b) The candidate must show, on demand, the Admit Card for admission in the Examination Hall. A candidate who does not possess a valid Admit Card shall not be allowed to enter the Examination Hall by the Centre Superintendent.
- c) Candidate is to appear in the Examination only from the Examination Centre allotted to him/ her and as reflected in the Admit Card. Under no circumstances, will he/ she be permitted to appear in the Examination at a different Examination Centre.

11.1 USE OF UNFAIR MEANS/MALPRACTICE

Use of unfair means or malpractice allows a candidate to gain an undue advantage over other candidates. It includes, but is not limited to:

- a) Being in possession of any item or article which has been prohibited or can be used unfairly, including any stationery item, communication device, accessories, eatable items, ornaments or any other material or information relevant or not relevant to the examination in the paper concerned;
- b) Using someone to write examination (impersonation) or preparing material for copying;
- c) Breaching examination rules or any direction issued by NTA from time to time in connection with the conduct of NSSNET-2025 examination.
- d) Assisting other candidates to engage in malpractices, giving or receiving assistance of any kind, directly or indirectly or attempting to do so;
- e) Writing questions or answers on any material other than on the OMR answer sheet given by the Centre Superintendent for writing answers;
- f) Tearing of answer sheet, any page of the exam booklet etc.;
- g) Contacting or communicating or trying to do so with any person, other than the Examination Staff, during the examination time in the Examination Centre;
- h) Taking away the answer sheet out of the examination hall/room;
- i) Smuggling out answer sheet or part thereof;
- j) Threatening any of the officials connected with the conduct of the examination or threatening any of the candidates or using violence against anyone;
- k) Using or attempting to use any other undesirable method or means in connection with the examination;
- Manipulation and fabrication of online documents viz. admit card, rank letter, self-declaration, etc:
- m) Forceful entry/exit in/from Examination Centre/Hall;
- n) Use or attempted use of any electronic device after entering the Examination Centre;
- o) Affixing/uploading of wrong/morphed photographs on the application form/admit card / proforma;
- p) Erasing or obliterating any information printed on the OMR answer sheet;
- q) Providing incorrect information on the answer sheet;
- r) Making fake claims by manipulating the responses in OMR sheet uploaded on website for challenge before or after declaration of result.

- s) Creating obstacles in smooth and fair conduct of examination or creating disturbance to others inside the examination hall / room / centre.
- t) Making an approach or attempting to influence the outcome of the result after the examination.
- u) Any other malpractice declared as unfair means by the NTA.

11.2 PUNISHMENT FOR USING UNFAIR MEANS/MALPRACTICE

During the course of, before or after the examination if a candidate indulges in any of the above or similar incident, he/she shall be deemed to have used unfair practices and booked under UNFAIRMEANS (UFM) case. The candidate would be debarred for 3 years in future and shall also be liable for criminal action and/or any other action as deemed fit.

11.3 CANCELLATION OF RESULT

- a) The result of NSSNET-2025 of the candidates who indulge in Unfair Means/ Malpractice will be cancelled and will not be declared.
- b) Similarly, the result of those candidates who appear from the Centre other than the one allotted to them, write on the Exam booklet / OMR Sheet of other candidates or allow other candidates to write on their Exam Booklet / OMR Sheet will be cancelled (and will not be declared).

POST EXAMINATION ACTIVITIES AND DECLARATION OF RESULT

12.1 DISPLAY OF SCANNED COPIES OF OMR SHEETS ON WEBSITE:

- a) NTA will display the scanned images of OMR Answer Sheets and recorded responses by the machine, of all the candidates, at NTA website. Exact date of display of scanned images of OMR Answer Sheets, would be communicated after the examination on NTA website.
- b) Applicants will be given an opportunity to submit representation, online, against the OMR grading by paying a non-refundable processing fee of Rs. 100/- per question challenged.
- c) Representations made by the candidates against the OMR grading will be verified by the NTA from the actual record and the same will be updated in the data, if challenges are found to be correct. However, no intimation in this regard will be sent to individual candidate.

- c) Challenges made by the candidates will be verified by the NTA with the help of panel of subject experts. If found correct, the answer key will be revised accordingly. Based on the revised Final Answer Key, result will be prepared and declared.
- d) No individual candidate will be informed about the acceptance/non-acceptance of his/her challenge.
- e) The key finalized after the challenge will be final.

12.3 PROCEDURE FOR DECLARATION OF RESULT:
